## Outdoor Event Risk Assessment

Applies to all events promoted by or organised by the kennels (so does not apply to event arranged by individuals to raise funds for us).

## All events

The welfare of the greyhounds should be put first. Everybody should be clear that any decision they make to call off an event, take a dog to the vet or remove themselves or their dog from the event will be supported by WGW, even if it proves to be unnecessary.

## An individual needs to be identified as having responsibility for the event and ensuring:

- 1. That there is responsible person at the event who can:
  - a. call off / abandon event
  - b. make the decision to alter proceedings
  - c. insist a dog is taken home or back to the kennels
  - d. insist a dog is taken to the vet
- 2. that fresh water available
- 3. that a first aid kit is available
- 4. that the nearest open vet is identified and the vet knows they are our emergency vet for the event. That a named individual at the event has the contact details and knows how to get there
- 5. that somewhere is identified where hounds can go for some peace and quiet if they need a rest
- 6. that they know where cars will be parked and which car would be used for vet runs

## Weather conditions

Check the forecast 2 or 3 days before the event (and again the day before). Take a thermometer to events to help decisions on the day. Referring to the chart (large breed) next page:
